



Most Rev. Bishop Sam Jacobs was born in Mississippi, USA. He graduated from The Catholic University of America with a Masters Degree in Philosophy as well as a Masters Degree in Education/Administration. He was ordained a priest in 1964. He was installed Bishop of Houma-Thibodaux in 2003. Since then he held numerous national and curial positions of responsibilities and memberships. He also served as Chairman and Director of many religious and educational institutions as well as the Chairman of USCCB Ad Hoc Committee on Catholic Charismatic Renewal. In 2004 he became Chairman-elect of Bishops' Committee on Evangelization.



Michelle Moran is a native of England and a founding member of Sion Catholic Community for Evangelism. With a Masters Degree in Pastoral Theology she worked full time in the Church both nationally and internationally. Michelle is also the author of *Pass It On* (practical hints on sharing your faith), *Crossing The Line* (evangelization in a Catholic context) and has written numerous articles for Catholic and ecumenical magazines and journals. Currently, she is the Chair of the National Service Committee for Catholic Charismatic Renewal in England and Wales. In 2007, she was elected President of ICCRS. In 2008, Pope Benedict XVI appointed her a member of the Pontifical Council of the Laity.



Archbishop Thomas Christopher Collins is a native of Guelph, Ontario. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1973. Bishop Richard J. Grecco was born in St. Catharines, Ontario. He completed his theological studies at St. Augustine's Seminary, Toronto, the Gregorian University in Rome, and in 1982 he received the degree of Doctor of Theology from the University of St. Michael's College, Toronto. He taught at St. Augustine's Seminary, the University of St. Michael's College, and St. Joseph College in Edmonton. Bishop Grecco is the senior Vicar General and the Auxiliary Bishop of Toronto as well as the Episcopal vicar for ethnic communities. He is Chair of the CCCB Episcopal Commission for Christian Education (English sector), and is an Episcopal advisor to the *Third Continental Congress on Vocations*. He was recently appointed the CCCB national liaison with the Catholic Charismatic Renewal.
